SERMON QUESTIONS

Read Proverbs 20:6, 31:3 slowly and deliberately (Groups: read it twice with different readers)

What makes a "good" man and a "good" woman? What qualities, habits, and attitudes come to mind?

Why does Proverbs 20:6 compare the boasts of a man to his actual actions? What does this teach about the connection between what a man says and does?

Why is fearing the Lord of infinitely more value than looks or charisma? What does this teach a woman about what is important in life?

Read Titus 2:1-8. If you are an older (it's up to you to decide **\B**) man or woman, what direction do these verses give you? If you are a younger man or woman, how do these verses call you to grow up to Christian maturity?

How can you encourage someone to continue in godliness today? Men, who is another man you could call or text to thank them for their example? Women, who is a sister-in-Christ that you can bless by letting her know her fear of the Lord is admirable?

Husbands, how can you let your wife know she is precious to you today? Read Proverbs 31:10 and following.
