SERMON QUESTIONS

Read Isaiah 40:12-26 (Groups: read it twice with different readers)

Why would author David Wells say God often feels “weightless” in our time? Do you agree or disagree? What will inspire people to consider the significance of God?

Define transcendence. What other words, concepts, or attributes of God are helpful to you in comprehending his transcendence?

Read 1 Kings 8:27. Where does God dwell? Read Isaiah 66:1. What caution is there for us when we try to make God fit into earthly spaces or, even, confine him with our own imaginations?

How are God's transcendence and his immutability (he does not change) related? If God were able to change for the better or change for the worse, how would that negate his transcendence? Read James 1:16-18.

Read John 4:24. What does it mean to worship God in spirit and in truth? Why are these the ways a transcendent God is rightly worshiped?

God's transcendence makes him trustworthy. Why? How do we draw strength and receive mercy from him? Read Isaiah 40:27-31. What is making you weary that you want to bring to him?
