SERMON QUESTIONS

Why did Moses kill the Egyptian? Read Acts 7:23-29. While his intentions may have been noble, were they right?

What is the significance of Moses sitting by a well (v. 15)? Read Genesis 24:11 and 29:2. Why would readers of Exodus be intrigued by Moses starting his family the same way Isaac and Jacob started their families?

Why was it necessary for Moses to experience failure and grow in humility? How have you grown through your failures? Can you now see God working for good where you thought you had flopped?

What have you prayed for over a long period of time? Has God yet answered that prayer? What encouragement does it give you that the Hebrews prayed for hundreds of years and then God began to act?

Where else might you put your trust, other than in Jesus Christ? How should we pray? Read Matthew 6:8.
